Since 2002, The Children's Cancer Center of Lebanon (CCCL), a regional center pioneering in the treatment of children with cancer, has treated, to date, over 1,100 children with cancer and offered around 4,000 consultations to patients from Lebanon and all over the region at no cost to their parents, without any form of discrimination and with complete dependency on donations.

Thanks to CCCL's international affiliation with St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee, U.S.A. and the rigorous research of the doctors and scientists at the American University of Beirut Medical Center (AUBMC), the CCCL is proud and glad to have an average cure rate of 80%.

The center admits patients, with a non-discriminatory admission policy, as young as few months old and keeps

Therefore, CCCL relies purely on donations; with a yearly budget of 15 million USD.

This is why; the CCCL, as a Center of Excellence, has very high standards and quality of medical care; and we are a reference center for other pediatric cancer centers in Lebanon and centers of 22 East Mediterranean countries: Algeria, Armenia, Bahrain, Egypt, India, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, KSA, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Oman, Pakistan, Palestine, Sudan, Syria, Tunis, Turkey, UAE, and Yemen.

> We admit patients as young as few months old and keep on treating patients until they reach 18 years of age. We have a non-discriminatory admission policy, where the patient is required to not have started treatment; and we accept all patients for diagnosis and support of their treatment.

> All patients referred to the CCCL are offered thorough diagnostic tests and admitted based on our admission





policy; and the patients we are unable to admit are referred to other hospitals.

What is Childhood Cancer?

Cancer is a result of changes in the body's cells that cause them to grow out of control, it appears in humans of all ages; however, cancers that occur in children below 18 years of age (childhood cancers) are largely different than those that occur in adults.

What about the Treatment?

Cancer treatment consists of at least one, but in most cases a combination, of the following:

- Chemotherapy
- Surgery, including special types of surgery such as Limb Salvage Surgery
- Radiotherapy
- Bone Marrow Transplantation

The duration of treatment at the CCCL in most cases ranges between 6 months and 3 years, depending on the cancer type. If not treated, cancer is fatal.

What are the most Common Types of Childhood Cancers and their Treatments?

1- Leukemia:

Leukemia is the most common childhood cancer, 41% of all cancers in children less than 15 years old. Its treatment

consists of chemotherapy for most patients and Stem Cell Transplant for some patients.

The average cure rate at the CCCL is 80%

2- Brain Tumors:

Brain Tumors are the 2nd most common childhood cancer, 20-25% of all cancer in children less than 15 years old. Its Treatment in most cases consists of a combination of chemotherapy, Surgery and Radiation therapy

The average cure rate at the CCCL ranges between 40 and 80% depending on tumor subtype and stage.

3- Lymphomas:

Lymphomas is the 3rd most common childhood cancer, 10-15% of all cancer in children less than 20 years old. The treatment consists of chemotherapy and radiation in some patients

The average cure rate at the CCCL is 90%

4- Bone Tumors

Childhood bone cancers are Osteosarcoma, most common and Ewing's sarcoma, 2nd most common. The treatment consists of chemotherapy and surgery for osteosarcoma, as for Ewing's sarcoma it consists of chemotherapy or

The average cure rate at the CCCL is 50-70%

5- Soft Tissue Tumors

Childhood soft tissue cancers are heterogeneous in nature; their effective treatment requires multidisciplinary team and plan. Its treatment consists of a combination of chemotherapy, surgery, radiation therapy.

The average cure rate at the CCCL ranges between 40 and 70%; depending on tumor type and extent.
